Dear Families,

Welcome back for semester 2! My name is Amanda O'Mara, and I am very excited to be your child's **Algebra I** teacher this year -- some of you already know me, and I'm meeting some of you for the first time. I believe that every student is capable of achieving success in <u>math</u> and problem-solving, and I look forward to working with you and your child throughout the semester to ensure that we reach that goal. Below you will find important information about this class. Please read this letter carefully and write any questions you have <u>below your</u> signature on the back of the last page.

Class Summary/Goals

Summary: Algebra I Part 2 is an important course for your student, both because of its alignment with the EOC as well as its college-level rigor and problem-solving emphasis.

- This course is aimed to help your child master math content that will enable them to be successful on the EOC, and to hone their problem-solving skills to ensure they make a smooth transition to high school to the next step. We will cover introductory algebra topics such as algebraic expressions and equations, linear and exponential graphs, and quadratic equations.
- Assessments are a mix of unit content, EOC questions, and performance tasks. Unit tests are worth 100 points, quizzes are worth various points (depending on the number of questions), and performance tasks are counted as quizzes.
- Students will be assigned homework 2-4 times a week, as needed.
- No extra time on tests, quizzes, classwork, or homework, unless your child has accommodations for extended time.

Goals:

- 1. 85% mastery on all quizzes and tests OR 3% pts of growth from Quarter 3 to Quarter 4
- 2. Proficiency on the EOC (A score of "Good" or Excellent"), taken in May 2017

Requisite Supplies

- **(1) 3- OR 5- Subject Notebook.** Students will add to their notebooks every day, so it is imperative that all students have a notebook dedicated to this class. This notebook will stay in the classroom the majority of the time, and can be checked out with Mrs. O'Mara as needed. If you were with me in the fall, you will probably need a NEW notebook for this semester. I HIGHLY recommend a Mead Five Star notebook, if it's in your budget. The size makes it the easiest and fastest for our work.
- Scissors, (4) glue sticks, and colored pencils. We will be creating interactive notebooks as our learning archives, which requires students to have access both IN and OUT of class to these basic school supplies.
- 1 pack of lined paper.

- **1 pack of pencils.** Students are required to provide their own writing utensils on a daily basis. I do not have and will not provide this most basic of school supplies.
- **1 scientific calculator: TI-30X IIS, \$13 at Wal-Mart. (See PAGE 4 for description.)** You may also purchase a TI-30XS. These are a little more expensive (usually between \$15-\$20) but will last your child all throughout high school and is an excellent investment.


